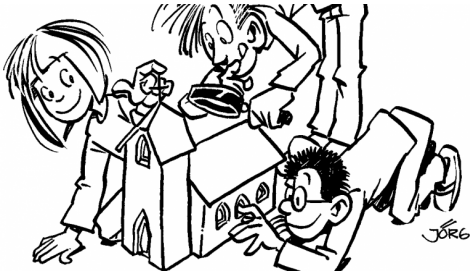


Parish without a youth group?

We are supposed to stall for everything. If people are wanted for any task, the extra effort is expected from us. Everywhere we are stopgaps.

They're glad we're doing the work, but they don't ask for it.

The only time people ask how we are doing is when difficulties become public.

Our youth group is well integrated into the community and our work is appreciated. We are comfortable in the community!

We are often overwhelmed because superhuman demands are often placed on us. In addition to the work or school load, we are still expected to be the scapegoats for our parents' parenting mistakes. Sometimes we get a little frustrated when we have to take the rap for problems we didn't cause.

We are thankful that we have the full support of the church leadership in our not easy task. It is a great help to us to have a place where our concerns are taken seriously!

Without the support of the congregation, without the sustaining prayers, I could not do my tasks!

Yes, that is the way of the day. There are positive, joyful statements but also resigned voices. What picture did a survey conducted by BESJ reveal? About 10% of the BESJ youth groups were asked about **integration** in the community, **information** in the community, **coordination** in the community, **funding** of the youth group. We are aware that this has created a one-sided picture, because the church leadership would also have to be consulted about this. But every church and every youth group can take a closer look at their own situation. In the next article you will find the results of the survey

How the integration, information, coordination and financing can be regulated in concrete terms is presented in the following articles. The detailed information from the survey will also be included. In the detailed information, we were told the exact arrangements, so we have a wealth of options. Of course, every concern, every question, every problem can be solved and regulated differently. There is no one, absolutely good recipe.
