- anyone interested in nature

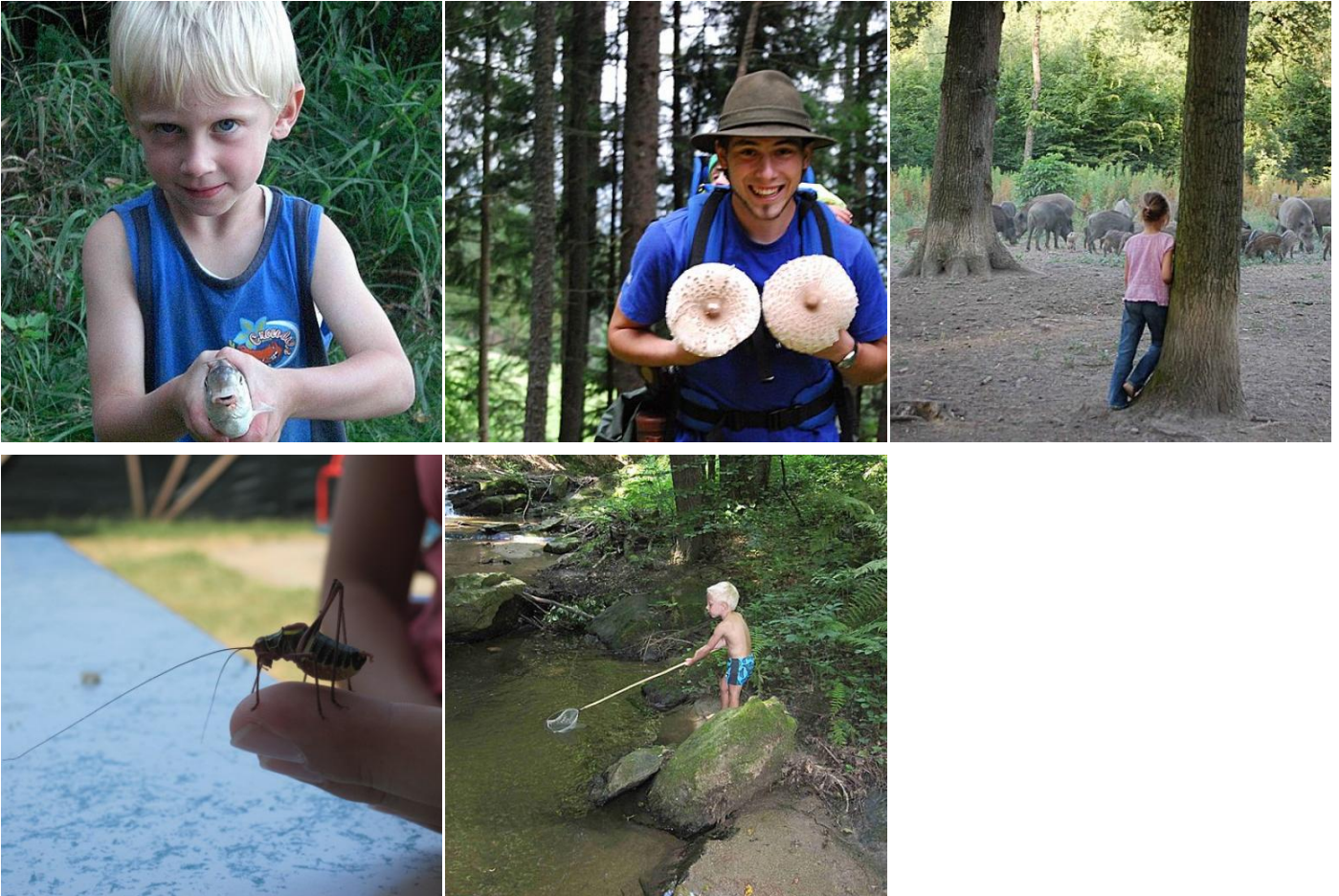
### What can I do?

- go once through the forest with a magnifying glass
- you can find a lot of forest games on the internet
- pack tree trunks as an adventure trail
- once through the forest without shoes and socks
- go in search of tracks
- forest menu á la season
- forest art - allow your creativity full bent
- imitate animals or play animal games
- put wood under the microscope
- ...

### What to look out for?

- observe the legal situation of the respective country
  - Austria:
    - forest cultures (=set young plants) & do not enter young forest under 3m height
    - restricted areas (forestry&hunting) observe (period and reason for the closure must be posted)
- ask landowners for permission
- avoid too much noise (the quieter the more animals you will see)
- take waste back home
